



Items identified in blue text call out important information



Remote entry system*

Functions only with ignition key not inserted

To lock doors: Press LOCK (1); pressing again within 5 seconds causes doors/liftgate to re-lock, horn to beep once and hazard warning lights to flash once if doors/liftgate properly closed. To unlock: Press UNLOCK (2) for driver's door, hazard warning lights will flash twice, press again within 5 seconds for all other doors. Panic alarm: Press ! (3); horn sounds, parking lights flash; press any button on transmitter to stop. After unlocking with the transmitter, all doors or the liftgate will automatically lock if a door or the liftgate is not opened within about 30 seconds.

Instrument panel lighting



With headlights ON: To brighten/dim turn thumbwheel up/down




Headlights/parking lights ON, ignition key must be ON: Illumination changes brightness when dimmer switch (4) is pressed (if equipped with black-out meter)

With headlights OFF†, key ON: Press instrument cluster dimmer select button (4) to select between 5 brightness settings for instrument cluster

HID headlights leveling switch



Adjusts headlight angle to compensate for weight of passengers and cargo, see Owner's Manual



Tilt/telescopic steering-wheel lever

Pull lever (5) down to unlock column, position tilt angle and length of steering column position

Tip: Telescopic function allows steering wheel to be adjusted closer or farther according to driver's reach

WARNING: Do not adjust steering-wheel while driving
Passenger air bag deactivation indicator light

Front air bag deactivation indicator light provides current status of front passenger air bag and pretensioner system. If total seated weight on front passenger seat is less than

approximately 66 lb., front passenger air bag deactivation indicator light illuminates, air bag/pretensioner will not deploy/activate in an accident. If the total seated weight is greater than approximately 93 lb., light does not illuminate, and the air bag/pretensioner will deploy/activate in an appropriate accident, see Owner's Manual for additional information on this feature and the air bag system.

Passenger sensing operation

See Driver's View. PAD indicator on dash will illuminate when passenger air bag is deactivated, child-restraint seat with child that weighs a combined total of 66 lbs. or less will deactivate front passenger air bag/pretensioner.

Tire Pressure Monitoring System (TPMS)*


Warning light illuminates for a few seconds with ignition on. If tire pressure is low, warning light illuminates with audible beep sound, adjust tire pressure to correct specifications, perform tire pressure adjustment before driving, a digital tire pressure gauge is recommended. Flashing warning light may indicate malfunction, dealer inspection required.

**Turn signal/lighting control lever**

OFF = Lights off

○ = Tail, parking and dashboard lights on: Rotate knob (1) to first notch

☰ = Tail, parking, dashboard and headlights on: Rotate knob (1) to second notch

AUTO* = With ignition switch in ON position; headlights and exterior lights automatically turn ON/OFF depending on surrounding darkness/lightness; rotate knob (1) to third notch


High beams on/off: Push forward/pull back to detent

To flash high beams: Pull back slightly and release

Turn signals right/left: Move lever up/down

⦿ = Fog lights* on: Rotate (2); functions only with headlight low beams on

Tip: Headlights switch off, parking lights remain on, if lights are left on and switch is in lock position or key removed

**Cruise control***

Operates above 19 mph

Press MAIN (3) to turn system on/off

To set speed: Accelerate to desired speed and press SET/COAST (5)


To accelerate: Press and hold RES/ACCEL (4); release button at desired speed

To decelerate: Press and hold SET/COAST (5); release button at desired speed

Incremental acceleration: Press and release (4); each tap = plus 1 mph

Incremental deceleration: Press and release (5); each tap = minus 1 mph

To cancel: Press CANCEL (6) or MAIN (3); tap brake pedal or depress clutch pedal*

**Wiper/washer control lever**

Single wipe: Push lever up

Washer: Pull back, also operates wipers

Intermittent wiper: One click down

To change interval speed: Rotate inner ring* (2)

Normal wiper speed: Two clicks down

High-speed wiper: Three clicks down

Auto*: One click down

Rain sensor senses rain amount on windshield, then controls wiper automatically


Rain sensor sensitivity is adjusted from high sensitivity (+) to less sensitivity (-) by rotating ring (3)

Rear window wiper/washer (5-Door only)

To activate rear interval wiper: Rotate knob (1) up to INT

To activate rear normal speed wiper: Rotate knob (1) up to ON

To activate rear washer: Rotate knob (1) to and release

To increase/decrease volume: Press (4)



When brake pedal is pressed, ABS automatically reduces hydraulic pressure to any wheel on the verge of locking up
You may feel a slight pulsing of the brake pedal and hear a clicking noise; this tells you the ABS is functioning properly; increase pressure on pedal for maximum braking

Tips: Maintain constant pressure on the brake pedal. Do not pump the brakes.




Tip: Use key number plate to purchase a new key; store in safe place separate from vehicle



Remote entry system*, see Getting Started

Illuminated entry system

Activates interior lights when dome light switch set to DOOR position; lights off after driver's door is locked or ignition in ON position



Power door locks* Master front door locks switches

To lock/unlock all doors: Press bottom/top of switch (1)


To lock doors without key: With door open, press bottom of door lock switch, exit car, close doors

To unlock: Use key to unlock driver's front door, rotate key to counterclockwise position for more than one second to unlock other doors

Manual door locks Lock button

To lock: Press front of button (2) toward door handle

To unlock: Pull front of button away from door handle




Child-safety locks

Located at the edge of rear doors

To activate: Rotate childproof lock (3) in direction of arrow using key tip (doors open from outside only); rotate in opposite direction to deactivate

WARNINGS: Since children may access either rear door, child-safety locks for both rear doors should be activated
Never leave a child in car with key in ignition




Power windows*

Ignition must be on
All windows controlled from the driver's armrest; passenger doors have separate switches

1. Driver's window: One-touch-down; push down firmly and release, window goes down all the way; pull switch back briefly to stop; press lightly and hold for normal operation

2. Passenger window switches: Push down and hold to open, pull back and hold to close

3. Power window lockout switch: Press down until it clicks, only driver's window operates; press again and passenger window switches function again




Dual power mirrors*

Ignition must be in ACC or ON

To adjust left/right mirror: Press control switch (1) left/right, press switch (2) in direction of desired mirror movement

Tip: To lock mirrors in place, move control switch to center position



Manual mirrors

To adjust: Move knob (3) on door





R = Reverse

N = Neutral
No gear engaged

D Drive (Overdrive)

For normal driving: Shifts through all forward gears automatically




M (Sport A/T manual shift mode)

Move shifter from D to M to engage manual shift mode, M will be illuminated for manual mode on

shift position indicator located in the instrument panel
Manual shifting of transmission is achieved by moving shifter back to upshift and forward to downshift, move shifter from M to D to engage automatic shift mode


Gear indicator (A/T only)*

Illuminated numeral of gear indicator located in the instrument panel displays current gear in Automatic and Manual shift modes



Manual transaxle

Depress clutch pedal to start engine and change gears



Ignition key release button (M/T only)

Press button (1) to remove key from ignition

Tips: Do not shift into 1st above 20 mph or clutch failure could occur
Resting your foot on clutch pedal while driving or using the clutch to hold your vehicle at a standstill while waiting on a hill may reduce clutch life




Shoulder belt height adjustment

To raise:
Push adjuster upward

To lower:
Pull button (1) and slide downward

Seat controls

Use age appropriate child restraints, see Owner's Manual and state or province laws

Child-safety seat

To install in rear outboard seats: Use dual locking mode retractor seat belts; see Owner's Manual for proper installation and child seat tether and LATCH system instructions

Safety belt emergency locking mode


Belts lock only on hard acceleration, braking, cornering or impacts of about 5 mph or more

Automatic locking mode (front passenger and all rear safety belts only)

Must be used when installing child-safety seat

To activate: Pull belt fully out of retractor, allow belt to retract until click is heard; belt will only tighten

To disengage: Unbuckle belt and allow belt to retract fully



Split fold-down rear seatbacks

To fold: Push release knob (1), push seatback down

To return and lock: Push seatback firmly until latched, make sure seatbelts are returned to original positions

☀ Tip: 4-Door has seatback locks as part of trunk security







Control positions for maximum defrost

Fan to maximum, temperature to maximum hot, air flow selector knob to

Tips: To help prevent windshield fogging in humid weather, select before starting engine
 To prevent moisture buildup, never drive with system off
 Objects placed under the front seats may interfere with air flow to the rear



Information display

Information display (1) has the following functions: Clock, ambient temperature display* (AMB), automatic climate control display, audio display and trip computer*

Trip computer* can display current fuel economy, average fuel economy, approximate distance you can travel on available fuel and average vehicle speed







Tire economy and tips

Check pressure at least monthly when tires are cold

Tires should be of the same make, kind and dimension

Maintain correct front-end alignment and tire balance; rotate tires at 7,500-mile intervals; see Owner's Manual for rotation chart

Tire pressure

Decal on driver's door provides tire pressure information

Tire chains*†

Use only SAE Class "S" chains; install on front tires as tightly as possible and re-tighten periodically; do not use chains on dry roads, aluminum wheels, or with tire pressure monitor system, damage may occur, use on steel wheels only



Luggage compartment internal safety release

Allows you to escape should you become locked in trunk. Slide illuminated release lever in direction of arrow; lever will glow if it has been exposed to light. Located on interior trunk lid.



UNDER HOOD



2.0/2.3-liter Engine

1. Engine coolant reservoir

Level should be between COLD FILL RANGE indicator marks

⚠ WARNING: Never remove coolant reservoir cap while engine is running or hot; remove only when safe

2. Engine oil filler cap

See Owner's Manual for recommended engine oil viscosity

3. Engine oil dipstick

Fluid should be between F and L on dipstick; do not fill above F

4. Brake/clutch fluid reservoir

Fill to MAX mark with DOT 3 fluid; check with cap on

💡 Tip: Clutch uses same reservoir as brakes

5. Battery

6. Fuse panel

Push latch in, lift cover must be between the indicator marks on the dipstick

7. Air filter

8. Automatic transaxle fluid dipstick*

Check with transaxle in park, engine on and at operating temperature

9. Hood latch

Pull up to release hood

10. Power steering fluid reservoir

Level should be between MIN and MAX lines

11. Windshield washer reservoir

Fill with windshield washer fluid

💡 Tip: Check all fluids with vehicle parked on a level surface and engine off unless otherwise stated

Break-in period

First 600 miles: Avoid heavy braking and acceleration; drive at varying road and engine speeds

💡 Tip: Follow the same procedures with newly overhauled engine or when brakes are replaced

Maintenance notes:

Rotate tires every 7,500 miles or sooner if needed
Replace cabin air filter every 25,000 miles or 24 months
Replace (FL22)* engine coolant at 120,000 miles

💡 Tip: For severe driving conditions, Owner's Manual recommends changing oil and filter at 5,000† miles
